

**VILLAGE OF SPECULATOR PARKS & PLAYGROUNDS**  
**YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR KNOWING PARK RULES**  
**PLEASE OBSERVE THE FOLLOWING:**

- ALCOHOL** Generally, alcohol is not permitted in any Village Park. Approval will only be granted for events that have a licensed purveyor who must provide a certificate of insurance indemnifying the Village, proof of liquor license to service alcohol and a caterer's permit as required in §98 of the NYS Consolidated Law - Alcoholic Beverage Control, Article 7, to the Village Board of Trustees at least two (2) weeks prior to the event.
- GLASS** No glass beverage containers allowed in Village Park.
- DOGS** Dogs must be leashed and under the control of its master at all times. Owners must clean up after their pet.
- BICYCLES** Bicycles must observe all vehicular codes. Riders are expected to be courteous and yield to pedestrian traffic. Helmets must be worn at all times by those requiring them. Bicycle riding is not allowed in the pavilion, basketball court or on the ballfield.
- CAMPING** No overnight camping is allowed except by Special permission of the Village Board of Trustees. Speculator parks are "day use" only.
- CAMP FIRES** No campfires allowed<sup>3</sup>.
- NOISE** No loud or unusual noises are allowed. All noise must comply with the Hamilton County Noise Law.
- VEGETATION** No taking, cutting or injury of any vegetation in the park is allowed.
- MOTORIZED VEHICLES** Motorized vehicles are prohibited from public property designated as walkways and any grass covered areas except designated parking area.
- WEAPONS, FIREARMS OR FIREWORKS** No person shall possess or discharge weapons, firearms, or fireworks in any Village Park.
- CLEAN UP** Upon completion of the event, the facilities must be left clean. Any additional cleaning performed by Village forces will be charged to the Permittee.
- PARK HOURS** The Village of Speculator Park is open from dawn to dusk. The Pavilion is used by special permission in excess of these stated hours. The Village Park areas are public spaces and therefore, the public has access to any part of the park during regular hours. Park areas cannot be reserved for the exclusive use of any one group and access to the area by the general public must remain available at all times. It is unlawful to obstruct the free travel of any vehicle or pedestrian over any of the walks or roads of any park property.
